2021 Mike Good Memorial Cup Rules

A. Registration/Format:

- 1. All players must be properly registered with a recognized US Soccer organization.
- 2. All age group/divisions will consist of pools/groups.
- 3. Tournament officials reserve the right to accept or deny teams based on prior league play and or other tournament history.
- 4. Tournament officials will place teams at their discretion, based on gender, age, and skill level
- 5. Teams will play a minimum of three games.
- 6. Age groups will be determined by 2021-2022 US Youth Soccer Birth Year Registration as listed below:

U15	2007	11 v 11
U14	2008	11 v 11
U13	2009	11 v 11
U12	2010	9 v 9
U11	2011	9 v 9
U10	2012	7 v 7
U9	2013	7 v 7

- 7. Rosters input at registration will be the official roster unless changes are made through tournament director. Deadline for roster changes will be September 1st.
- 8. Roster size limits/soccer ball sizes are listed below:

U13 and older 18 size 5 U11 and U12 16 size 4 U10 and U9 14 size 4

- 9. Players may only be rostered on one team per division, however may play in an addition division/age group at the discretion of the tournament director.
- 10. Team rosters should reflect Fall 2021 league rosters when possible
- 11. Guest players are allowed from the same club/association, guest players from different club/association allowed at the discretion of the tournament director
- 12. Once tournament bracketing and schedules are complete, there will be no refunds issued unless of a COVID-19 related cancellation.
- 13. Registration, including full payment of tournament fees are due to be complete by September 1st 2021.

B. Check-in / Player passes

- 1. All teams will be required to check-in by tournament official approximately 30 minutes before each team's first game at the assigned field or digitally if available
- 2. Teams are subject to check-in prior to every tournament game and are required to have player passes available at each game
- 3. A maximum of 3 coaches are permitted on the team side of the field and must be carded by team's or club's home federation
- 4. Any team found to have used an ineligible player in any game shall forfeit all games by a 0-4 score and may not continue to take part in the tournament

C. Scheduling / Standings

- 1. Each team will play a minimum of three games in a preliminary round of games with the possibility of a semi-final and final games.
- 2. Tournament will be organized at the discretion of the tournament director or his designee
- 3. Organization of tournament pools will be determined by number of teams registered per age group or division
- 4. Teams will acquire the following points based on tournament results: 3 points for a win, 1 point for a tie, 0 points for a loss
- 5. Point tie-breakers in preliminary round will be in the following order: head to head, goal differential, goals for, goals against, most wins, penalty shootout
- 6. A maximum 6 goal differential will be counted in standings
- 7. Standings will be updated the at tournament site and online as soon as possible by tournament officials

D. <u>Uniforms/Equipment</u>

- 1. With the exception, of the goalkeeper, each player shall wear a unique number and similarly designed jerseys
- 2. Goalkeepers must wear colors that differentiate them from field players
- 3. All teams must provide an alternate jersey (pinnies are acceptable). In the event of a jersey color conflict, the home team will change uniforms
- 4. Shin guards are mandatory and must be covered by a sock
- 5. No metal cleats are permitted
- 6. All equipment is subject to approval of the referee.

E. Laws of the Game:

- **All matches must be played in accordance with FIFA Laws of the Game except as specifically modified for youth play by USSF, US Youth Soccer and US Club with certain Amendments as follows:
 - <u>Substitutes</u> must be at the midfield line at the stoppage in play. Unlimited substitutions
 for all age groups will be allowed with the consent of the referee. Each team may
 substitute at any stoppage in play, at the discretion of the referee. Substituted players
 may return to play in the game
 - 2. <u>Build-out line</u> will be utilized for U9 and U10 age group. Attacking teams must withdraw behind this line when a keeper takes possession of the ball with his/her hands or a goal kick is taken by any player. Once the keeper or player has released the ball opposing players may cross the line. Goalies are prohibited from punting the ball.
 - 3. Duration of games will be two 25-minute halves for all age groups in all stages
 - 4. Discipline will be as follows;
 - Red card: player/coach will be dismissed from the current game and possibly additional tournament games, at the discretion disciplinary committee.
 - Spectators may be ejected from the tournament cite for improper conduct, at the discretion of the tournament officials or referees
 - 5. <u>Intentional Heading</u> is not permitted for U9, U10 and U11 age group. Violation of this rule will be indirect kicks from the spot of the violation, an indirect from outside the penalty box if the violation takes place inside the penalty box.

6. Offsides will be enforced at all levels at the half field line, not the build out line in U9 and U10 age groups.

F. Final/Semi-final game overtime rules

1. Directly to FIFA style penalty kicks at a nearby field chosen by tournament officials.

G. Forfeits

- 1. A maximum 10-minute grace period will be allowed after scheduled kick-off time before a game forfeited.
- 2. A team failing to field five players for U9 and U10, six players for U11-12 or seven players for U13 U15 at that time shall forfeit the game. Forfeits will officially be scored as 0-4.
- 3. A team that fields an ineligible player shall forfeit all tournament games. There will be no refund for any team that fields an ineligible player

H. Referees:

- 1. Referees will be assigned by referee assignor
- 2. Assistant referees may be utilized according to availability starting at the highest age group and level
- 3. Referee will be responsible for filling out game report card and giving it to tournament official at the end of each game. Game report card will consist of score and any cautions or sending offs.

I. Protests and Disputes

- 1. No protests on referee decisions will be heard, all referee decisions are final
- 2. All other protests or disputes may be heard at the discretion of the tournament director and his decisions are final

J. Awards

1. Award ceremonies will be conducted on or near the field immediately following the championship game by tournament officials.

K. Inclement Weather Procedures

- 1. Tournament officials have the authority to postpone, shorten or cancel a game due to inclement weather
- 2. In the event of a lightning delay teams are asked to take cover but remain on site for the duration of the scheduled game
- 3. Tournament officials will contact team coaches/managers as soon as decisions are made
- 4. If weather conditions or the state of the fields make it impossible to carry out the tournament to its full extent, it is up to the tournament officials to make the necessary decisions concerning the rearrangement or cancellation of games for any reason. Fees are non-refundable if games or the tournament are canceled for inclement weather, a portion of fee may be refunded at the tournament director's discretion.
